Cody Dumont -DoNH Commandant, John Nelson. *Nelson* shared that he wanted to come and check out the detachment meeting, he was a Marine Corps officer 2010-2014 as combat engineer and left as a Captain.

Approval of previous meeting's minutes:

Kevin Brown made the **MOTION** to accept the previous meeting's minutes; Marge Romano seconded the motion; **passed unanimously**

Anthony stated that there are several positions open at this point that need to be filled and asked the members present if any were interested in the Sr. Vice Commandant, Jr. Vice Commandant, or Quartermaster positions. *Peirce* then clarified for all that the SVC's main responsibility is fundraising, and JVC's main responsibility is membership.

Anthony then nominated Steve White for Quartermaster, and this was seconded by Paul Coutu. Steve was asked if he would be willing to volunteer his time to this role. White said he would be willing to be Quartermaster if voted in. A vote was taken of the membership, and the nomination motion was passed unanimously. White stated he is honored to serve and will get started tomorrow.

There were no volunteers at this time for SVC and JVC.

The floor was then turned over to Cody Dumont, Commandant of the Department of New Hampshire. *Dumont* performed the installation ceremony of Eric Anthony as the new Commandant of the Granite State Detachment. *Anthony's* term will expire in June 2026 as he is completing the balance of the prior Commandant's term.

Dumont then continued with some Department business for the detachment members. He advised all that when he became the Commandant for the Department, he was very clear that he would only be doing one two-year term. So, he is looking for volunteers to find the next Commandant for the Department with a term that will start halfway through 2026. Because the Department only meets quarterly, the search needs to start now. Nominations will need to be made at the September and December meetings and a vote to be had at the March 2026 meeting, for the new person to take office in April/May of 2026. He would like three people on this committee, and not all from the same detachment. At this time, no one volunteered to be on the Commandant Search Committee.

Dumont then discussed the upcoming Marine Corps 250th Birthday Ball that is scheduled for November 10th in Franklin, NH at the new Easterseals campus. This event will be at no cost to attendees. When members sign up, they will not need to pay anything, however if a non-member registers that person will need to pay a \$50 deposit that they will receive back when they arrive at the ball. This process is to ensure that if someone says they are going they will show up or they are out \$50, which will be easier for planning purposes with a good head count. He is looking to form a committee to do the planning and finding of the speakers for the birthday ball. He is looking for three speakers and he has the keynote speaker already in mind and he has laid out what he would like for the other speakers that the committee members will need to try and locate. He would like one member from each detachment to be on this committee. Sara Steffen volunteered to be on the committee for the Marine Corps Ball.

Dumont then opened the floor to questions from members. Covatis asked where the Department of NH meetings are held quarterly? Dumont answered that they rotate location each meeting to a different detachment so that members from all over the state can attend at least one meeting and voice any questions or concerns. September's meeting will be at the Dillion Detachment in Bow, and the December's meeting will be at the Granite State Detachment.

Brown then stated that he received an email from Mike Martioski and the way it was worded concerned him that he would be unavailable for an extended period of time and he wanted to make sure he was OK. Dumont explained that Mike and his wife were going on an extended vacation that they would be driving across the country and visiting several states so he would not be available.

With no other questions, *Dumont* then went onto advise everyone that the NH Charitable Gaming dates at the Revo Casino in Lebanon, NH for the ten days set aside for the Department of New Hampshire will be July 20-July 29. He then transitioned into a discussion on the cost to cover the Marine Corps Ball. They selected the Easterseals new location in Franklin, NH because the entire campus is veteran geared with housing, hotel, services and hospitality. The Department voted at the last meeting to use the funds raised from the casino dates mentioned above to cover the cost of the ball. There was some concern that the funds received from the NH Charitable Gaming could be used to host a ball of this nature. The Department researched with various officials at the NH Charitable Gaming as well as with a Senator that wrote the bill for this law, and all asked stated that the funds received were to be used on anything that followed the mission and traditions of the charity receiving the funds. As the MCL holds a Marine Corps ball every year in some capacity, this would qualify as a long-standing tradition and therefore acceptable to use the funds received from the NH Charitable Gaming. Easterseals and even Revo will help to promote the Marine Corps Ball for the Department to get the word out about the event. The hotel that is on the Easterseals campus is reserving 50% of their rooms for the night of the ball, which is not covered by the Department.

Dumont then stated that the MCL would still be raising the flag at the state house on the morning of the Marine Corps' birthday and then there will be a breakfast nearby and there will be the traditional Marine Corps luncheon and then the Department event in Franklin that night. So, it is going to be a full day of Marine recognition, connection, and enjoyment.

Dumont then yielded the floor back to Anthony and thanked him for the time.

The Goffstown Varsity Softball game fundraiser raised \$241 with the proceeds agreed for half to go to the State Troopers and half to GSD 542 and be used for veterans with mental health issues. *Steffen* shared the background behind this fundraiser with the above information as mental health issues are close to her family and we appreciate her sharing her story. *Romano* made a **motion** to bring the total for the NH Troopers share of this fundraiser, \$120.50 up to \$500 or \$379.50 as a donation to the NH Troopers, the motion was seconded by *Pat Anthony*, voted unanimously and passed.

(this information would be good for our members to know in case we should run across a veteran with a housing need!). *Anthony* stated that also attending the ceremony was Executive Councilor John Stephan who told him his son was a Marine, and *Anthony* said he would be contacting him for his son's information to ask if he would be interested in joining the Marine Corps League.

Old Business:

- Romano made a **motion** to donate \$2000 to Building Dreams for Marines, White seconded the motion, and after a vote the motion passed unanimously. With this level of donation, it will make GSD 542 a sponsor of this event in Hollis, NH in August.

New Business:

- Sara Steffen has volunteered for the Marine Corps Ball Committee with the Department.
- The Department meeting in December will be held at GSD at the place of our choice. Per *Dumont* a date and location will need to be selected and let him know. The detachment will provide lunch at 1pm and then the meeting will be held after. Will need space for about 15-30 people. Last year at the December meeting they stuffed stockings for a local hospital pediatric ward

- in Concord, so this could be done again to a local group in need. *Peirce* said he will look into VASH and see how many kids.
- Toys-4-Tots need to have the boxes registered with the Londonderry distribution center. *Covatis* asked if the toys stay in NH and *White* said the toys are sorted by age at the location in Londonderry and he believes the toys stay local. *Steffen* said she has experience with this program and is willing to help if information is needed.
- *Covatis* asked if the detachment still has a bugle and a bugler? No. He has offered his services as needed for Honor Details and he just needs one day to get his uniform in order. He uses electronic recordings with the bugle, but the sound is comparable to a live player.
