Cody Dumont, Commandant of Department of NH, Sgt Kelvin Gonzalez, Alex Grandprey, and Greg Thompson, Commandant of Dillion Detachment

Prior to the official business commencing the detachment was joined by Alex Grandprey who is organizing a rifle raffle to raise money for the Company B Marine Corps Ball. They need an organization with a 501(c)(4) to facilitate the raffle as they are not allowed to with the Marines. He passed around the rifle that they would be raffling off, worth about \$800. They have partnered with Granite State Indoor Range where they will display and sell tickets as they have a lot of foot traffic. They will do all the work promoting and selling the tickets, GSD is welcome to sell some as well, but GSD would be the financial agent only. *Peirce* made the motion that Granite State Detachment 542 will be the fiscal agent to help the Marines of Company B with the rifle raffle. The motion was seconded by *White* and the vote passed unanimously.

Commandant *Anthony* and Chaplain *Duquette* then performed the swearing in ceremony of a new member to the detachment, Michael (Mike) Sousa. Following the ceremony everyone welcomed him to the detachment.

Dumont and Sgt Kelvin Gonzalez then presented that the Marine Company B and the Department of NH would be doing a joint ball this year. Company B needed an organization that had a non-profit status and *Gonzalez* reached out to *Dumont* to discuss doing this event jointly. *Dumont* stated that they will use the same cake vendor, the same tin picture vendor, and the same photographer as last year, and they will use a DJ that is known at the Dillion detachment. Everything else will be handled by Company B.

They have not set the ticket prices yet, but that will be done soon, and sales will start mid-September. *Gonzalez* is expecting 200 from Company B and about 100-150 from MCL, but the tickets will be open to any Marine in the state of NH. *Dumont* then asked both Commandant *Anthony* and Commandant *Thompson* if the funds raised for the joint ball that has been canceled could be given to this event, with the permission of the donors. *Romano* stated that the funds have been returned at this point already for GSD donors. *Gonzalez* stated that Company B

would be doing the ceremony from start to finish; he has a bronze star and a purple heart recipient as speakers, he will also be doing the seating chart, and the AV for the event. The date of the ball will be November 14th at the DoubleTree Hotel in Manchester. He will have a rough number of guests on November 1st for the hotel. *Peirce* mentioned that Governor Ayotte and Representative Pappas have been lined up to speak. *Gonzalez* said that he would put them in the front end before the ceremony and he requested that the speeches are kept short and non-political.

Approval of previous meeting's minutes:

White made the **MOTION** to accept the previous meeting's minutes; *Peirce* seconded the motion; passed unanimously.

Anthony shared the attached flyer for the Liberty House Veteran's Day Breakfast fundraiser. The event will be on November 7th at 8:30am at the LaBelle Winery in Derry, NH. *Peirce* mentioned that last year GSD sponsored the event at the Dog Tags level of \$1,500 that comes with a quarter-page ad and 2 tickets and a few other benefits. *Peirce* made the motion as the chair of the donation committee, that GSD 542 sponsor the Liberty House Veterans Day Breakfast at the Dog Tag sponsorship level for \$1500 and that the two ticket go to the Commandant and his wife to attend. The motion was seconded by *White*, the vote passed unanimously.

Anthony then turned the floor over to *Dumont* to discuss the dissolution of the joint GSD 542 and Dillion Detachment Marine Corps Ball committee and event. He summarized what happened with the email that was the center of a lot of the issues. He stated that this email was a discussion among Dillion detachment members that *Dumont* accidentally sent out to all of MCL in the state of NH. He had asked for grace and patience at the time the email was sent out with his apology for sending it without looking at the whole email chain. He then stated that if anyone would like to file a grievance he has drafted up some documents and given them to *Anthony* and he takes full responsibility for his part in the sharing of the email that was an internal conversation within Dillion. *Romano* expressed how this whole thing has impacted her and the attack on her character as she was the subject of most of this email. *Teresa Hamlin*, member and daughter of *Romano* also expressed how this email impacted her and her mother. *Romano* stated she is not a vindictive person and would not be filing a grievance against anyone, but she wanted everyone to know that she was hurt by this email event; she stated she

forgave *Dumont*. *Thompson* stated his apologies for his share of the responsibility in the email event. His intention with the email, at the end, was to bring in a lighter topic to the email chain, with an upcoming event that he thought some members might like to attend. It was not his intention to have the full email shared with all of MCL.

Romano then presented her MC Ball paymaster report. She stated per an email sent by Mike Martioski from Dillion Detachment that with the authority of Greg Thompson, Mike was to take out the sum of funds from the joint checking account for any funds given or supplied via sponsorships and put into the Dillion checking account. Mike then went to the bank and took out \$4100 in cash from the joint account and did not notify anyone on the committee until after it was done. At the beginning of the joint venture, GSD 542 had written a check from their detachment checking account to the venue as a deposit for the space. Then once Dillion joined in the event planning, Dillion supplied a check for \$500 to GSD for their 50/50 share of the expense of the deposit. Since the full deposit came from the GSD detachment checking account, the check for \$500 was put into the GSD detachment checking account. This was done before the joint account was set up. However, when Mike withdrew the \$4100 from the joint account he included the \$500 venue deposit which was not in that account to be taken. *Romano* reports that this resulted in the joint checking account being negative by \$121.13. She has sent back the checks for the sponsorships received, except for one as if she wrote out the check it would bounce. She asked Greg Thompson for this deficit of \$121.13. *Thompson* asked for a letter from her explaining what was owed by the Dillion Detachment, and she agreed to supply this letter. Note: after the meeting, *Romano* sent the following email to *Eric Anthony* about this letter. "Greg requested a letter last night regarding the details of Dillon's share of the operating expenses for the Ball. I provided each of you with a spreadsheet last night detailing the transactions of the Ball checking account and Dillon's specific share. This should be sufficient to assist you in coordinating reimbursement from Greg."

Anthony then let the membership know that Jesse Stufflebeam has resigned his post of SVC and has left the MCL. He stated that *Stufflebeam* was disappointed with how the Department handled the communication and conflicts within the Marine Corps Ball planning committee and he has resigned. He and other members commented that *Stufflebeam* was a good addition to the detachment, and it is a shame to see him go. A search for a new SVC as well as JVC will begin shortly.

Lastly, *Anthony* reminded the membership that the Department of NH Quarterly meeting will be on September 27th starting with lunch at 12:30-1:30 and then the meeting which will be followed by a Devil Dog Growl. He encouraged all to attend and to sign up on the Department website to do so with link here.

<https://nhmarines.org/sign-up-for-department-meeting/> Since GSD 542 will be hosting this meeting, *Anthony* asked for volunteers to organize the ordering of the food for those in attendance. Steve White and Pat Anthony both volunteered.

Reports of Officers

Senior Vice Commandant: (Vacant) –

Stufflebeam has resigned. *Zurwell* advised that the Bass Pro Shops fundraiser on August 14-15 is fully staffed and let people know that SignUp Genius will send out reminder emails to those that signed up with the time slot(s) they signed up for.

Zurwell then asked *Anthony* about the Cruising Downtown Manchester event and if he had reviewed the information that *Stufflebeam* had sent him about this event.

Had *Stufflebeam* used the sign-up code that was given by the organizers to sign up the detachment? *Anthony* stated that he has been otherwise occupied with moving his brother from California to NH, selling his property in CA and buying a property here in NH, so he has not reviewed the emails that he has received from

Stufflebeam. He stated he will review and advise the status of this event. *Zurwell* said that once he has the chance to do this that she will create the SignUp Genius form to get volunteers to cover the tent for the day. The event is on September 5th so there is not a lot of time to get volunteers.

Paymasters Report: (Marge Romano) – See attached report from Paymaster.

\$83,362.61 balance; \$0 outstanding checks; committed funds \$5,239.00, deposits \$1,950.00, resulting in an available balance of \$78,123.61. Specifically mentioned were the funds from the DoNH of \$1500 for MC Ball, dues renewals via check \$210.00, and dues renewals via Zeffy \$175.

Romano advised that the Revo Casino check photo shoot will be on August 18th and the detachments time slot will be 4:10pm -4:20pm. She also mentioned that she shared an email she received from Revo Casino for a save the date of their Gala on October 10th at the DoubleTree hotel and if someone is interested in going to let her know.

Romano then advise about the research she has done for the CD option to move some funds (\$50K or the amount approved by membership), from the checking account to a CD to earn interest until the funds are needed next year. She said that she checked four banks and all had roughly the same interest rates for a six-month period of about 4%. She prefers to go with Citizen's Bank because that is the bank that the detachment uses for all its banking and it would be convenient. *White* stated he has had positive experiences with Citizen's Bank. *Peirce* then stated that the amount to be considered for the CD should include the funds needed for operational expenses for the 6-month period as well as the planned donations which he will explain later in the meeting. Following some discussion, *Coutu* made the motion to move \$40K from the checking account to a 6-month CD with Citizen's Bank. The motion was seconded by *Peirce* and the vote passed unanimously.

Romano then let everyone know that a second notice for membership renewals was sent out yesterday via email. To date she has received 15 renewals. *Brown* stated that if it looks like some people are not renewing to share those names so that other members here at the meeting could reach out to them, *Romano* stated that once she sends a third and final reminder and the renewal window is near its end she will share the list of those that have and have not renewed with *Anthony*, *Zurwell*, and *Brown*.

FUNday Breakfast Report: (Marge Romano)

- The 50/50 raffle raised \$65. The raffle winner, Paul Coutu. Current total in the account is \$652 for the Trade School Scholarship.

Chaplain Report: (Joe Duquette)

Sick, Injured, Hospitalized Members: *Duquette* stated everyone seems to be in good health. *Anthony* asked that *Romano* check in with David French to ask for an update on how he is doing and if he needs more assistance. *Romano* is friends with his wife and will reach out to her. She did say that it is still hard for him to eat and he cannot talk yet but uses a white board.

Members / spouses recently passed away:

Updates from VA Hospital: There will be BINGO this month on August 16 at 1pm, if interested in joining, meet in the back parking lot.

Judge Advocate: (Chris Peirce) – *Peirce* stated nothing to report.

Junior Vice Commandant: (position open at present) – NTR

Quartermaster: (Steve White) – *White* stated he is still looking for the challenge coins in the storage unit, but he has not found them yet as there are a lot of places where they could have been placed for safe keeping. Once they are found he will provide a count and promotions can start for sales. *Anthony* asked that *White* coordinate with the new member Mike on uniform items. *Anthony* also mentioned to *Sousa* that if he is interested in joining the firing detail the detachment would cover the cost of the uniform for those events.

Webmasters Report: (Jo Zurwell) –

Zurwell reported from her written report, see attached the status of the website and the activity for the site. The big news is the updated “Those We Serve” page is live on the website to include a short 40 second video at the top with all of the donation presentations that have been made in the past year or so.

Scouting Report: (Kayley Bass/Sara Steffen) –

Steffen advised that there was nothing to report.

Correspondence: (Commandant, Paymaster, et al) Eric Anthony reporting

Anthony read a thank you letter from Easterseals for the donation for the Maurice Labbe memorial stone and for attending the ceremony. See the attached letter for full details.

Aide De Camp : (Kevin Brown)

Brown brought in a few books from home if anyone was interested in them. He then mentioned that he wanted to address the Mike M. emails, he said he was very angry when he read it and emailed Mike directly to say as much.

Brown then stated he had been in contact with Alex Ray’s office, and he was going back to Ukraine on August 18th, but when he returns and is able to get 2.5 hours to drive to Manchester and then attend a meeting he would. *Brown* said that we need to think of what we can do to support his local organizations. He then continued to say that he is concerned about losing any members but directly Michelle Vanvalkenburg and Glenn Thayer. *Romano* stated that Glenn was currently in Alaska and should be back in a month or so.

Donations inbound: (Paymaster, Commandant):

Romano stated that the Chester Rod and Gun Club Shoot Event to benefit GSD 542 raised \$2150. She asked David Freschi if they had a way that they would like to see these funds used, and David said he would leave it up to GSD 542 to decide.

Donation Review Committee: (Chris Peirce)

Peirce went over the Donation Review Committee's recommendations for the 2026-2027 donations. (see the attached report) This includes Chaplin's CLC Bingo, quarterly food pantry donations, 13 different Veteran Groups, two of which have already been given, and one was approved earlier in this meeting. There is also discretionary donations and miscellaneous support for Marines in needed. This listing of recommendations totals \$26,720.00. *Peirce* then made the following motion; To accept the yearly donations for 2026-2027 as presented by the Donation Review Committee totaling \$26,720.00. The motion was seconded by *Coutu* and passed unanimously.

Awards: (Commandant, et al) –

Romano gave *Anthony* the lifetime membership card for Dick Anagnost. *Anthony* said that he will do up a certificate to be presented to him as well and work out a time to present it.
